

Abraham and Sarah Rodabaugh: Ancestors and Descendants

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Abraham Rodabaugh¹ and his ancestors were members of the Church of the Brethren, commonly called "Dunkers" or "Dunkards." The Dunker Church was founded in Germany at the beginning of the 1700s. It was a radical Protestant sect that borrowed beliefs and practices from the earlier Anabaptists and German Pietists.

Dunker innovations were not well received by their Lutheran social context. Soon after their separation from the established church, the group in Germany came under heavy persecution. Members of the Dunker Church emigrated from Germany and arrived in the mid-Atlantic colonies in the early 1700s. So many emigrated, in fact, that the church died out in Germany. On the new continent, though, the church flourished, with large groups spreading in the 1700s and early 1800s to Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Delaware and Ohio, and smaller groups to other states and territories.

Although we think of the Dunkards within the larger context of “German Baptist Brethren,” or even “Pennsylvania Dutch,” they retained an independent style of worship and social behavior. Any good history of the Church of the Brethren² will describe their distinctive doctrines and practices (pacifism, love-feasts, footwashing, etc.). The Dunkers also preserved their native German dialects in their worship and group life. Some isolated Dunker groups still conduct their worship services in German.

In the sections below I will introduce my great-grandfather, Abraham Rodabaugh, and review what is known about Abraham and Sarah’s ancestors. I will then present a list of Abraham and Sarah’s children and grandchildren and illustrate the family with pictures that I have collected. Following this is a list of the names and addresses of correspondents and researchers mentioned in this document. At the end is an index of person names and place names.

Abraham and His Parents, Jacob and Luvina

Abraham Rodabaugh³ was probably born and reared within the full practice and piety of the Dunker church. He inherited his Dunker faith from both his father’s and his mother’s family. We have a good primary source for part of Abraham’s early life with the Dunkers: a statement in his own hand which was published by Earl Harvey in *A History Of the Church of the Brethren in the District of Southern Missouri and Arkansas*.⁴ Abraham writes:

In the year 1867 two families of the Brethren, five lay members -- David Lair and wife, and **Jacob E. Rodabaugh** and wife (father of the writer) migrated

from Darke County, Ohio from the Painter Creek Church to Phelps County, Missouri, twelve miles south of Rolla, Missouri.

Abraham, who was born in Indiana on 31 July 1853,⁵ was a boy of 13 when he and his mother and father moved to Missouri. His father, Jacob,⁶ who was born in 1820 or 1821, was about 46. Jacob was born in Ohio. Jacob's wife, **Luvina Wimmer**,⁷ was two years younger and was born in Indiana. Since Jacob's family remained in Ohio all of their lives, it is probable that Jacob himself, after he became a man, lived in Indiana long enough to marry Luvina and have Abraham. There is an Indiana marriage record for Jacob Rodabaugh and "Lavina" Wimmer that dates the marriage at 4 March 1850 and places it in Henry County, Illinois.

Nothing is known about whether Jacob and Luvina had other children. Since Abraham's parents were past 30 when he was born, it can't be ruled out that there were older siblings of Abraham which were already out of the home and who consequently did not make the trip to Missouri with their parents. However, older relatives in my family who knew Abraham when they were young say that he was an only child.

Luvina Wimmer's Ancestors

In 1999 I corresponded with Jim Loving, a descendant of an uncle of "Lovina" Wimmer. He sent me the following information on Luvina's parents:

Abraham Wimmer, b. Nov 16, 1795 in Franklin County, Virginia d. Oct 16, 1868 in Henry County, Indiana.⁸ He married, first, on Nov 11, 1817, **Hannah Heckman** Hannah was b. Aug 27, 1795, d. Apr 03, 1848, in Henry County, Indiana. Children:

Unfortunately, Jim Loving was not able to provide specific documentation for his information on this family.

A rather large ancestral tree of Abraham and Hannah can be found on such sites as Ancestry.com and WikiTree.com, but much of it lacks documentation for crucial links.

Jacob's Parents and Siblings

I have been trying to track down Jacob's family in order to make the connection between our line and the other Rodabaugh lines. After a year of following a number of leads, I discovered that Jacob was the son of the **Adam and Anna Catherine Rodabaugh** who were living in Van Buren Township of Darke County, Ohio, in the 1850s and 1860s.⁹ Census records were of no use in finding Jacob's family: the 1820-1840 censuses catch Jacob at home, but do not give his name; the 1850 and 1860 censuses do not show Jacob living at home. Jacob shows up, however, on the probate records at the time of Adam's death. Proof that the Jacob who is Adam's son and the Jacob who is Abraham's father are the same person came through his sister's movements. The Catherine Lair who came to Missouri with Jacob and Luvina was known to be the youngest daughter of Adam.

The picture that emerges from probate and census records shows that the following persons in Adam and Anna Catherine's family lived to maturity:¹⁰

- (4) Solomon, b. 1824, d. 1907, m. Tryphena Burk (1825-1909) circa 8 Feb 1849, d. before 1909.
- (5) Elizabeth, b. circa 1827, m. Joseph Taylor (b. circa 1815, d. 1893) circa 1849.
- (6) Henry, b. circa 1833, d. 1866, unmarried.
- (7) Simeon, b. 19 February 1837, m. Lucinda Strader (b. 1839) on 28 January 1858, d. 13 April 1919 in Saginaw, Michigan.
- (8) Anna Catherine, b. 21 March 1839,¹² d. 1916, m. David Lair on 2 June 1860.

On the next few pages I review what is known about each of Adam and Anne Catherine Rodabaugh's eight children and about their descendants.

Jacob E., we have seen, must have lived in Indiana for a while, probably before, but certainly after, his 1850 marriage to Luvina. Jacob was still there in 1853, since Abraham cites Indiana as his birthplace. After Adam's death in 1867, Jacob and his family and his sister Anna Catherine and her family all left for Missouri. They report their starting point as a church in Darke County, so Jacob and Luvina must have moved to Darke County before 1867. After the move, Jacob and Luvina appear on the 1870 and 1880 censuses living in Phelps County, Missouri, next to their son Abraham and his family.

Margaret was born on 28 April 1814.** (Gene Andrews has collected information about this family. The data in this section marked with a single asterisk is from his summary "Decendants of George Andrews"¹³ and the data marked with a double asterisk is from Henry Rich's summary.¹⁴) Margaret married George Andrews on 8 August 1841 in Montgomery County, Ohio,** and moved with him to Delaware County, Indiana, where George taught school in the winters.** She moved to Henry County before the late 1840s, then on to Jay County, Indiana, in 1851.** She was living about 40 miles away from Henry County, in Salamonia, Jay County, Indiana, at the time of an 1870 deposition in her brother Henry's probate. The *Biographical Memoirs of Jay County*¹⁵ lists her children.¹⁶ Margaret died on 20 July 1904.**

George Andrews was born 7 September 1805 in Connecticut and died 28 May 1854. He was a graduate of Yale College and a pioneer educator in Ohio and Indiana. He met Margaret while teaching in Dayton, Ohio. After their marriage they lived in Delaware County, Indiana, as mentioned above, and also near Muncie, Indiana, where George was in charge of the public schools. He retired from teaching because of declining health in 1851 and moved to his farm in Madison Township in Jay County, Indiana. He died from an injury received in a mill accident.*

Adam and Catherine Rodabaugh deeded 80 acres of land in Jay County to Margaret in 1842. The land was sold in 1856 by the guardian for the children.*

The children of George and Margaret Andrews:

In a letter to his brother Samuel, Adam notes that George Andrews had died in May of 1854, leaving seven children. Another letter from Anna Catherine's brother Jacob notes that the Andrews family is "having a hard time of it" because of George's death.

Barbary, named perhaps after Adam's mother Barbara (probably **Regina Barbara Klingensmith**), seems to have stayed in her parent's home all of her life. Her omission from the estate records of her father in 1865 may indicate that she was no longer living.

Solomon appears in the 1860 census for Darke County, age 36, with a wife "Trifina," age 35, and three children. Like Adam, Solomon lived in Van Buren Township, very likely on the same homestead as Adam. He appears again in the 1870 census, age 46 as expected, with his household consisting of Tryphena and five children. On the 1880 census we find that three children are still living with them. Here are their children:²⁰

Tryphena, Solomon Rodabaugh's wife, was the second of eleven children, daughter of William T. Burk (b. ca 1799-23, d. Aug 1873) and Elizabeth Ballard (1804-1876).²⁵ She was born in Tennessee and her father was from Ohio. Solomon and Tryphena appear on the Steuben County, Indiana, census in 1900, but they soon moved back to Darke County. They are buried in the West Branch Cemetery in Darke County. Their tombstone dates are 1825-1909 (Tryphenia) and 1824-1907 (Solomon). In newspaper clippings on file at the Garst Museum in Darke County (name of newspaper uncertain), both Solomon and Tryphena were residents of the Brethren Home in 1907. Solomon "arose from his bed telling his wife he was going to the bathroom, which he did, but raised a window in that room and stepped out onto a verandah, from which he slipped and fell to the ground, a distance of about fifteen feet, and lay there unconscious until found between four and five o'clock, dying soon after from the shock.... [Solomon] had been sick with the grip and was no doubt somewhat delirious at the time." Tryphena's obituary is dated 1909. She was 83 years, 7 months, and 12 days old when she died at the Brethren Home. Just the week before she died, she had visited her sister, Mrs. Pauline McGriff of Arcanum, Ohio. She left another sister at Muncie.

In the Darke County land records there is a deed from Adam to Solomon in which Solomon receives 40 acres from the west side of Adam's property.²⁶ The Court had to reaffirm that Solomon owned this two years later, just after Adam's death, perhaps because the land had been deeded so near in time to Adam's probate.

Elizabeth's surname was Taylor at the time of her father's death. She is almost certainly the Elizabeth married to Joseph Taylor who is living next to (or on) her father's

farm in 1850. Elizabeth and Joseph were married in Darke County, Ohio, on 16 May 1849. Their children were:²⁷

- (1) Anna C. Taylor, b. circa 1849.
- (2) Barbary Taylor, b. circa 1852.²⁸
- (3) Henry Taylor, b. circa 1854.
- (4) Susan Taylor, b. circa 1856.
- (5) Sarah Elizabeth Taylor, b. 14 July 1860 in Darke County, d. 14 March 1939 in Greenville, Ohio. Buried in East Zion Cemetery, m. Robert Washington on 15 January 1883 in Darke County, then Wilson H. Heffner on 29 September 1900 in Darke County.²⁹
- (6) David S. Taylor, b. 10 July 1869³⁰ in Darke County, d. 25 November 1939 in Greenville, Ohio, buried in Greenville Cemetery. Unmarried.
- (7) Noah A. Taylor, b. August 1863 in Darke County, d. 4 April 1948 in Greenville, Ohio, buried in County Home Cemetery. Unmarried.³¹
- (8) Albert Frank Taylor, b. 23 December 1875.³² Living in Ansonia in 1948. Died 1951.

Joseph Taylor made out his will in 1891 and appears to have died in 1893. He was listed on the 1880 census as engaged in ditching. He was living in Van Buren Township of Darke County, on a six-acre farmstead located in Section 2, Town 9, Range 3E. His land was willed to his wife Elizabeth. She was still living at the time of the 1900 census.

Henry died about the time his father died. His probate records are in Darke County. The executor of the estate was the same neighbor, Christopher C. Briney, who did the father Adam's estate. Henry appears not to have married. His estate was barely more than some bad promissory notes. In an 1857 letter, his father says that Henry had gone to Colts (Coles?) County, Illinois and was earning \$18 per month. On the 1860 census he was living at home again. He is recorded as serving in Co. B, 110th OVI, in the

Civil War, having entered on 9 August 1862. He was captured on 5 May 1864 at the Battle of the Wilderness in Virginia and no further record of him was found.

Simeon is also in the Darke County censuses. According to his pension papers, he was married on 28 January 1858 in Gordon, Ohio, to Lucinda Strader.³³ In 1860 Simeon and his wife Lucinda Strader (b. circa 1837 according to the 1850 census, circa 1839 according to the 1860 census) are living with his father and mother. Simeon enlisted for the Civil War at age 25, on 9 August 1862, in Co B, 110th OVI, and was transferred to Co E, 9th Regiment, Veteran Reserve Corps, on 8 April 1864. He was mustered out on 12 July 1865 in Washington D.C.³⁴

In the 1880 census Simeon is in Darke County, but in Twin Township. In 1891 Simeon gives his residence as Greenville Township. In 1900 he and Lucinda are living in Greenville, Ohio. Simeon gives his occupation on the 1900 census as “gardener.” By 1908 Simeon was living with his daughter Rebecca at 302 Webber Street, Saginaw, Michigan. He died there in 1919. Lucinda died on 7 April 1909. There is a picture of Simeon on the wall of the Darke County Courthouse with other Darke County Civil War veterans. Children of Simeon and Lucinda:³⁵

- (1) Daniel, b. 27 February 1859, d. 1860.
- (2) Rebecca J.,³⁶ b. 17 January 1863, m. Mr. Augustin.³⁷

Simeon claims that as a result of sickness during the war he later lost an eye, but a grandson claims that he lost the eye while chopping wood.⁴²

The youngest daughter, *Anna Catherine*, married David Lair on 2 June 1860.⁴³ She was born on 21 March 1839.⁴⁴ Anna Catherine and David are in the 1860 Darke County census living next to her parents. As we have seen, they moved to Missouri in 1867 with Anna Catherine's brother Jacob. Anna Catherine died in Union Township, Pulaski County, Missouri, near the town of Waynesville, on 20 February 1916.⁴⁵ She is buried in Pisgah Cemetery. Their known children are:⁴⁶

The father David Lair died in Frankswitch Township of Pulaski County.

Adam Rodabaugh died about 1864/65. His quarter section in Van Buren Township, or at least the remaining 120 acres of it (part had been deeded to Solomon), were sold in a Sheriff's sale in early 1866. Land records seem to indicate that Adam owned smaller properties in two adjoining sections in Darke County. He bought his Van Buren Township quarter section in section 23, the records say, in 1842, presumably the date he arrived in Darke County. A 1857 land owner map of Van Buren Township shows Adam's property located in the southeast quadrant, less than a mile from the Painter

Creek Church of the Brethren. Anna Catherine outlived Adam; she was still alive in 1870, residing in Phelps County, Missouri, with her daughter Anna Catherine Lair.

Jacob's Mother's Family

Adam's wife, Anna Catherine, was born Anna Catherine Pitsenbarger.⁵⁰ According to a genealogy of the Pitsenbarger family prepared by Credith Schaefer, Anna Catherine is the granddaughter of **Abraham Pitsenbarger** and **Elizabeth? Pitsenbarger** of Black Thorn, Shenandoah County, Virginia. He was a Revolutionary War veteran and died in 1781.

I have prepared a chronology of Abraham Pitsenbarger and his immediate children.⁵¹ In that genealogy I record Abraham's children as:⁵²

- (1) Jacob (b. 1 February 1767).
- (2) Abraham (m. Mary Cowger in 1795).
- (3) Elizabeth Ann (m. John Moats circa 1793).
- (4) Peter (b. 20 Jan 1774, d. 3 Dec 1837, m. Mary Magdeline Fry).
- (5) John.
- (6) Philip.

The father of Anna Catherine Pitsenbarger is Abraham's first son **Jacob Pitsenbarger Sr.**,⁵³ who married **Margaret Butcher** (b. 1769, d. 25 March 1848) in 1792 in Virginia. Abraham Pitsenbarger's son Jacob died in 1840 in Darke County; both he and his wife are buried there. His children, according to his will, were:

- (1) Anna Catharine (b. 26 July 1794).
- (2) Anna Phoebe (m. Daniel Feters in 1817 in Montgomery County, Ohio).
- (3) Barbara (b. 27 October 1796, d. 4 April 1820 in Montgomery County, Ohio, m. John Cox about 1819).
- (4) Betsy (m. Adam Slonecker in 1821 in Montgomery County, Ohio).

The Immigrating Ancestor of Adam Rodabaugh

Adam Rodabaugh's line can be traced back to an immigrating Rodabaugh named Christian.⁵⁵ I have written a genealogy entitled "Four Generations of the Immigrant Christian Rodabaugh (1707?-1779) and His Family" which outlines the children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren of the immigrant Christian Rodabaugh. This section is a brief synopsis of what is covered in the larger work.

Adam's grandfather, **Christian Rodabaugh** either appears as a passenger on the ship *Betsey* in August of 1739 or the ship *Robert and Alice* in December of 1740. Christian Rodabaugh (b. circa 1707, d. circa 1779) and **Elizabeth Whitehead** (b. circa 1717) had four Rodabaugh children:

- (1) **Christopher Rodabaugh**,⁵⁶ m. **Regina Barbara Klingensmith**, b. circa 1750, d. 1799 in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania.
- (2) John, m. Elizabeth Boyer, b. circa 1749, d. 1828.
- (3) Adam, m. Susannah Marchand, b. 1754, d. 1830.
- (4) Elizabeth, m. first Peter Broadsword and second Daniel Weigle, b. circa 1752.

Elizabeth Whitehead had been married earlier to Stofel Weisskopf (Whitehead), and had two Whitehead children:

- (1) Magdalena, m. Abraham Studebaker, b. circa 1740, d. 1821.
- (2) Valentine, b. circa 1843, d. 1829, m. Sophia Maria.

In the early 1750s, Christian and Elizabeth lived in Maryland. About 1761 Christian and Elizabeth and (most of) their children pioneered in the settlement of Westmoreland County in western Pennsylvania (south and east of Pittsburgh).

The daughter of Christian and Elizabeth, Elizabeth, had four children: Susanna, Mary, George and Peter. The son Adam had no children. John had seven children who lived to maturity.

The third son of the immigrant Christian Rodabaugh, Christopher, had nine children. They were probably all born in Westmoreland County. Christopher died before his other brothers and sisters — about 1799. Some of his children were raised by his brother Adam. We know the birthdates for many of his children from baptismal records. Here they are in the presumed birth order (I have only listed children who lived to maturity — at least two others died as children):

- (1) Christopher's daughter Mary, b. 1783, married Henry Willyard, and immigrated to Kentucky. She is the ancestor of Mary Ellen Ferrin. They had seven children.
- (2) Elizabeth, b. 1785, married Jacob Fry and remained in Franklin Township, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania.
- (3) The oldest son was Adam, who is the Adam in Montgomery and Darke Counties in Ohio that I have described above as the grandfather of my great-grandfather Abraham. Adam was born about 1788.
- (4) Susannah, b. 1790, married John Klingensmith and moved to Indiana with her brother Samuel. Fifteen children lived to maturity.
- (5) Salomie, b. 1792, married her first cousin David.
- (6) Seth, b. 1796, was raised by his uncle Adam, and came with him to Ohio. He was married in 1817 to Mary Hollingsworth while residing in Montgomery County, Ohio. He moved to Randolph County, Indiana, then in 1825 to Pike Township, Marion County, Indiana. He was there for twenty years, then moved on west (his wife and most of his children stayed behind in Indiana) and supposedly died in a local war in Kansas. He had eight children.

- (7) Samuel, b. 1798, married Sarah Klingensmith and moved to the vicinity of Indianapolis, Indiana, in 1829, settling near New Augusta station. He had seven children who lived to maturity.

Abraham's Marriage to Sarah

We return now to Abraham Rodabaugh, to pick up his life after he moved to Missouri with his parents. He appears as a sixteen-year old boy on the 1870 Missouri Federal Census, living in his parent's household. The next time Abraham is mentioned in public documents is in 1874: on January 8 of that year, in Phelps County, Missouri, Abraham married **Sarah Lucinda Coleman**. He was about 20, she was 19.⁵⁷.

Coleman is not a Brethren name, and what we know about Sarah's family does not hint any Brethren connections. It seems reasonable to conclude that

Abraham, living in a Brethren settlement with almost no Dunker women of his age, married outside of his church.

Sarah Coleman and Her Ancestors

Sarah and Abraham probably met because they lived on neighboring farms. We find the Colemans near the Rodabaughs in the 1870 census, when Abraham was 16 and Sarah was 14 or 15. The Colemans had been living in Phelps County, Missouri, for more than ten years before the Rodabaughs arrived: we find them there in the 1860 census. The family in 1860 is listed as follows:

Note the female as head of the household. Sarah's mother (S. A., i.e., Sarah A) is listed without a husband in both the 1860 and 1870 censuses. It may be that her husband died just before 1860. Or they may have separated. It would appear that the family came from Indiana after 1854, judging from the birthplaces of the children. Knowing this allowed me to locate the family in the 1850 Daviess County, Indiana, census on p. 129. There we discover that the husband's name: Hammond Sr. The entry is as follows:

Notice that there is a Gilmore boy living in Sarah's family in 1860 who was called "Coleman" in 1850. Sarah's name before she married Hammond Coleman may have been, by birth or by a previous marriage, Gilmore. This is reinforced by a marriage record in Lawrence County, Indiana, that shows a Sarah Gilmore marrying a Hammond Coleman on September 9, 1844. The marriage happened when the two oldest boys in the family, John A. Coleman and Christopher C. Coleman/Gilmore, were three years old. The two three-year old boys at the time of the marriage could represent blendings from earlier families, or they could be, one or both, children born out of wedlock.

In the same county in Missouri at this time, by the way, we find an A. Coleman, with a family of seven, who came from Indiana about 1857. On the basis of research described below, I believe that this was Alexander Coleman, a brother to Hammond Sr.

Correspondence with persons doing genealogical work on Hammond Coleman have allowed me to carry the line further. Hammond, it seems, can be traced back four generations to a Peter Coleman who was born in 1740. An impressive amount of research has been done on this line by Lois Masters, the great-great granddaughter of Hammond Sr.'s sister, Maria Roberts. Research on the earlier branches has also been carried on by Julie C. Lindquist, whose great-great grandfather, Richard D. Coleman, was a first cousin to Hammond's father.

Here, in summary, is what Lois Masters, Julie Lindquist and others have found in their work. **Peter Coleman Sr.**, born about 1740, lived at one point in Surrey County, North Carolina, and moved to what became Grayson County, Virginia, about 1788. He married **Abigail Jayne**. They had ten children, as follows:

- (2) William (1768-????).
- (3) Mary (????-????), m. James Williams(?).
- (4) Abraham (1770-1840?), m. Elizabeth Parker.

- (6) Jerusha, m. Wells.
- (7) Charity (1774?-????).
- (8) Stephen H.(1782-1867), m. Sarah Rankin, Lucy Adkins, Christiana White.
- (9) Richard (1780-1860s).
- (10) Daniel (1787-1870), m. Sarah Kinder.

My great-grandmother, Sarah Lucinda Coleman, is descended from the third son of Peter Sr., Peter Jr., a waggoner. Peter Jr, Richard, Stephen, Daniel, and their mother, Abigail, moved from North Carolina to Pike/Floyd County, Kentucky. Peter was a prolific father, siring, it appears, some twenty children. His three wives, however, do not seem to have been in strictly serial order! Sarah and her family descend from the first wife, Charlotte Thompson. Peter Jr and Charlotte had the following children:

- (1) Alexander (1797-1873), m. Nancy Outen/Wooten, Milly Mills.
- (2) Mary (1798-????), m. Milton Howard Adkins.
- (3) **James** (1800-1839), m. **Elizabeth Williams**.
- (4) Easter/Esther (1806-????), m. Daniel Hensley, John Garrison.
- (5) Andrew J. (1809-1857), m. Nancy Connelly/Conley.
- (6) Nancy (1812-????), m. Davis.
- (7) Mahala (1816-1850), m. John Garrison.

Sarah Lucinda Coleman's line comes through the second boy, James. James moved as an adult to Lawrence County, Indiana. He and his wife had a family of nine:

- (1) **Hammond Sr** (1821-1858?), m. Lucinda Ray, **Sarah Gilmore**.
- (2) Alexander (1824-????), m. Merinday Jones.
- (3) Ruth (1826-????), m. Enoch Burton.
- (4) Charlotta (1828-1921), m. John M. Hammersley, James F. Fitch.
- (5) James W. (1830-????), m. Catherine Beasley.
- (6) Maria (1832-1903), m. James Roberts.
- (7) Jackson (1834-1864), m. Minerva J. Hildebrand.
- (8) Ann Elizabeth/Elizabeth Ann (1837-????), m. John Tanksley.
- (9) Williamson (1839-????).

We see in this family list that Hammond probably did have an earlier marriage, to a Lucinda Ray. In calling one of her daughter's Sarah Lucinda, Sarah Gilmore Coleman may have been recognizing the early death of her husband's first wife.

There has been quite a bit of research on parallel Coleman lines, especially on the children of Peter Jr's other wives. Some of this research is reported in the *Coleman World* newsletter edited by Fred Field.

Abraham and Sarah's Children

Although many of the Dunkers in Phelps County moved to lands in the neighboring Pulaski County in 1877, Jacob and Luvina and Abraham and Sarah remained in Phelps County until 1887. It was there that their first children were born.

Abraham and Sarah's oldest children⁵⁸ were John, Mary and **William Henry**. John was born in 1875, Mary in 1877, and William in 1879. The next three children⁵⁹ were, Anna L. (August 1881), Edward A. (October 1884) and Andy C.⁶⁰ (June 1887). In January of 1884, a Dunker minister, Christian Holdeman, made a visit to the Waynesville congregation in Pulaski County. He recorded that at his meeting with the church "Brother Abraham Rodabaugh was chosen to the ministry."⁶¹ This would refer, I suppose, to a minister of the first degree, one with ministerial duties but restricted authority to hold major celebrations, such as the love feast. ("Minister" in the nineteenth century Dunker

Church referred more to a person's office than his occupation. Abraham probably supported himself with farming for most of his life.) Abraham was assisting a Brother Solomon Stump, a minister of the second degree. It is not clear how Abraham and his family related to the Waynesville church, which was perhaps ten to fifteen miles distant after 1877.

Abraham reports that in 1887 he "disposed of his holdings in Phelps County, and moved into the bounds of the Osceola Church." The Osceola Church was in St. Clair County, on the western side of Missouri. The specific congregation to which Abraham became attached was called Brush Creek. It became known as the Oak Grove Church in 1894 and Abraham is listed as its minister. When Abraham and Sarah moved to St. Clair County in 1887, the church there still met in the home of Abel and Anna Killingsworth, but by 1892 a new church building had been constructed.⁶² A 1903 map of St. Clair County, Doyal Township, shows the Rodabaughs and Killingsworths in section 1, township 36, range 26. This section of land almost borders the Sac River.

After moving to St. Clair County, Abraham and Sarah had two more children: Herbert⁶³ in 1892 and Charles in 1895. By 1900 the three oldest children were out of the home. The "H. Rodabaugh" listed as a delegate to the District Meeting of the Southern District of Missouri and Northwestern Arkansas held in Vernon County, Missouri, on 21 October 1903, may be my grandfather, William Henry, who was then 24 years old.

In 1910 Abraham and Sarah and their three youngest children were living on a farm next to the same Abel and Anna Killingsworth family in whose house the church started.⁶⁴ The Killingsworths, by the way, are discussed in the Harvey book. Abel was an elder in the church. Abraham and Sarah in 1910 (but not in 1900) lived next to **Walter M. and Hannah A. Jordan** and their son William. The daughter of Walter and Hannah, **Lena Leota Jordan**,⁶⁵ married William Henry Rodabaugh. In 1910, however, William and Lena were not living next to their two sets of parents — the census records them as living in Doyal Township of St. Clair County, managing a general store and having two

children, Goldie and Sylvan.⁶⁶ William Henry's brother Edward⁶⁷ was also in Doyal Township in 1910, living on a farm with his wife Nannie and son Ralph.

Abraham died on his birthday, 31 July 1936.⁶⁸ The *Church of the Brethren Minutes of the Annual Conference* for June, 1937, lists him as having died recently. The Earl Harvey book says that after 1900 Abraham moved to California. Helen Machnicki, Herbert's daughter, believes that they only lived in California for six months. The same Harvey book records him as one of the "visiting brethren" at a district meeting of the Southern Missouri and Northwestern Arkansas Conference in November 1915, and the *Church of the Brethren Yearbook* for 1932 lists his address as "800 E. Grand River Street, Clinton, Missouri." He and Sarah were living in this house at the time of the 1920 census.⁶⁹ Sarah lived on in this house for many years after Abraham's death. My uncle Sylvan has a movie of her taken in 1951, taken in front of the house.

In a 1949 obituary of Herbert Rodabaugh, Sarah is said to be 94 years old. The obituary also indicates that two of Abraham and Sarah's other children, John and Lum, had died before Herbert. The two girls had married and their names are listed as "Mrs. Mary Millsap" and "Mrs. Will Gover" (Anna). Sarah died on 19 December 1955.⁷⁰

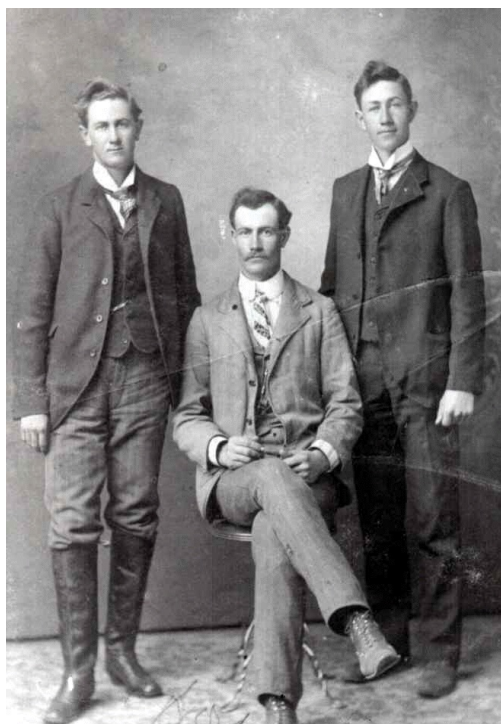

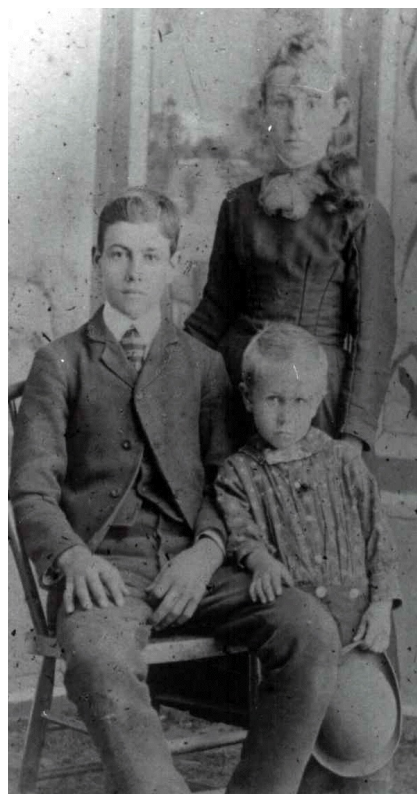

The names of married women are indexed under their maiden names for all historical persons (modern researchers are indexed by the name they use on correspondence). Where the surname was not available, I indexed the person under the single Christian name (even if it was a wife whose husband's last name was known).
